PROJECTS

SUPPLIES TO SUPPORT EMS CAPABILITIES
\$69,799.74

Direct purchase of mass-casualty and hemorrhage-control resources for each of the state's five EMS regions. Each region will receive: SMART triage tags, tourniquets, and SMART Triage Kits.

SUPPLIES TO SUPPORT ACTIVE ASSAILANT PROGRAM FOR MASS CASUALTY
\$37,891.45

Direct purchase of additional supplies to support mass casualty response. Each EMS region will receive: 4-inch OLAES bandages, tourniquets, and Curaplex Patient Transporters.

CR-MRC TRAINING ACADEMY
\$10,535

Awarded to CR-MRC, this project funds eight CR-MRC core volunteer in-person classes at the South Windsor Training Academy site, with the potential for some classes to be offered at alternative sites based on availability and time. Classes will cover: CPR, First Aid, Stop the Bleed, MAST, and Bloodborne Pathogens.

STATEWIDE MRC ASSESSMENT
\$16,373

Awarded to CR-MRC, this project funds the completion of a statewide assessment of MRC units to inform future training and recruitment activities, an annual MRC workshop, and a written summary document.

\$82,914.15**

A total of 27 training kits purchased to be distributed to all 22 Dahlgren participating hospitals and five training kits to be distributed to five free-standing emergency departments. Each training kit includes: a shuffle pit, training solution, training clothes, and 50 fiber tech clothes.

**PORTABLE SINK
PURCHASE
\$15,531.09**

Direct purchase of 25 portable sinks to be distributed evenly across the ESF-8 regions, with five sinks going to each region. Sinks can be utilized to support a variety of facilities to support hand-washing needs during water supply failures. Formal agreements will be arranged for the sharing, deployment, and emergency transfer of these sinks to ensure that they remain readily available for emergency response while allowing for coordinated use across partner organizations.

**EVACUATION SUMMIT
\$14,000***

Two training days will be offered to enhance evacuation knowledge in the state of Connecticut, including a seminar on evacuation equipment, evacuation planning, and best practices for using the equipment, as well as a hands-on training component with real equipment. Morning and afternoon sessions will be offered each day, with each session accommodating up to 30 attendees.

**CT HCC WEBSITE
REDESIGN
\$6,000**

This project supports the redesign and modernization of the CT HCC website. Changes will include clean semantic HTML, WCAG-aligned forms, navigation, and content structure, accessible color themes, typography, and contrast, proper alt text, aria-labels, landmark roles, and keyboard-friendly menus, and a fully responsive layout for desktop, tablet, and mobile devices. Updates will ensure ADA compliance WCAG 2.1 AA standards.
